Additions unveiled for third threshold of inscribed bricks at SPPD Memorial

The Santa Paula Police Memorial was the scene of a third dedication Saturday that brought together public safety personnel, elected officials and members of the public for the unveiling of the latest tier of bricks honoring those that served — and still serve the SPPD.

The ceremony was held at Railroad Plaza Park at the SPPD Memorial, an obelisk paying homage to two officers — City Marshal Henry Norman and Officer James Barmore — that died in the line of duty. The two were killed 40 years apart, Norman gunned down in 1913 and Barmore killed in a 1953 motorcycle accident while responding to call.

First dedicated May 21, 2011 to coincide with National Police Memorial Day, last May the monument was rededicated with benches honoring Officer Kim Hemminger and Reserve Officer David Bartlett, both killed in 2012 in separate off-duty traffic accidents.

Mayor Martin Hernandez, City Councilwoman Ginger Gherardi, Police Chief Steve McLean, former Police Chief Stephen MacKinnon — who was involved in the creation of the memorial — and City Manager Jaime Fontes were among those that attended the rededication as was Sharon Hemminger, mother of Kim.

According to SPPD Reserve Lt. BradTallent who worked closed with retired SPPD Lt. Carlos Juarez on the updates, "We're here to celebrate the improvements," and addition of the third tier. "Followed by coffee and donuts," traditionally considered the fuel of law enforcement.

After the prayer led by Deacon Al Guilin, Hernandez addressed the crowd.

'Santa Paula is a place that has many cultural assets," said Hernandez who thanked the original committee that oversaw the creation of the memorial.

"This monument means a lot...we all need heroes," and with the number of unprovoked fatal attacks on officers, Hernandez said police must be shown support.

We need hope, we need heroes our first responders are our heroes."

Monuments and memorials, Hernandez added, are important benchmarks for society: "I'm very proud my father is on the Farmworkers Memorial,"located in the same park.

In his 35 year law enforcement career, McLean said he saw 33 officers "lose their lives, almost one every year."

Officers are now being "ambushed and murdered" with recent incidents in Dallas, New Orleans and Las Vegas, tragedies that brought a groundswell of support for police.

We had the community come to the SPPD bringing cakes and flowers, a senior citizen asked if

Don't be horn swaggled: landlubbers are also invited to partake in Pirate partying with grog, booty, raffles, a Silent Auction, tastings from fine restaurants, no host bars, dancing to Sound Effect band and DJ Bruce Barrios and a night of pillaring and plundering with every wench and scallywag that sails the ocean blue.

Guests will say "Blow me down!" when they arrive at Limoneira's Pirate Park for the first portion of the evening where from 5:30 to 7 p.m. dead men will tell no tales and buccaneers will vie to show how well they can Talk Like a Pirate.

In this special competition the winner will have booty to take home while the losers might just risk walking the plank of the Ventura Party Boat (VPB), a special added attraction that will put the wind in everybody's sails.

The authentic VPB is an occasion. attraction with a cause created by owners Scott and Judy Robinson to bring awareness to Down Syndrome

"It's wasn't a planned business," said Scott of his 25-foot-long ship that has sailed into many a party and special event.

"We were fortunate to have a son, Reese, born with Down Syndrome 11 years ago and we were exposed to how special that life is. Judy especially got very involved," in causes and issues related to DS, a genetic disorder typically associated with physical growth delays, characteristic facial features, and mild to moderate intellectual disability.

Three years ago the couple decided to adopt another DS child and found then 3-year-old Ryan in an orphanage in Bulgaria, a challenging and sad existence for even the hardiest child.

The boys are the reason for the VPB, to raise awareness of Down Syndrome and in Ryan's case, help pay off the hefty adoption and travel

"Why a pirate ship? I do a lot of rough carpentry and I used to tell my neighbors," in his Ventura neighborhood that he would build a ship for Halloween.

'One year" said Scott, "I did," a 25-foot-long pirate ship façade that was attached to the house to provide a ramp for Trick or Treaters to leave the porch.

"It grew from there to what it

Scott likes being the captain of his own ship, which can be customized no matter what the

But he knows that a pirate boat is particularly popular.

Why? "That's a good question. One of the biggest things is pirates have a life of freedom out on the seas, taking what you want, living without everyday hassles. I don't know for sure but people are really fascinated by pirates."

And fascinated by his boat, which has made appearances from San Francisco to Anaheim and beyond for kid and adult birthday parties, parades and corporate

Scott is promising bigger and better things for Moonlight at the Ranch X: Party Like a Pirate.

I'm excited! I'm going to go all out and bring everything for it and try to make it a great event as much as I can."

He is in the midst of improvements and embellishments to make his boat shipshape and more authentic, picking out the accessories that will finish the seafaring picture of scallywags and their wenches — even female pirates - out of a good time.

Scott is hoping people will enjoy his boat, but "I always want to make sure that people get the message about Down Syndrome. They should take a chance," and adopt a DS child.

"It's amazing how positive the influence our two boys have had on our community and the people they come in touch with."

At the September 10th Moonlight, lads and lassies will yell "Ahoy mateys!" and batten down the hatches at 7 p.m. to set sail from Pirate Park to Treasure Island —

NEWS Storm Trooper tells Rotarians 'How Star Wars Saves the World'

The "Force" was with Rotary
when they met a Star Wars Storm
Trooper in an epic battle of fun at a recent meeting when club members learned about a unique organization where the bad guys do good.

The presentation by attorney Doug Ridley of the Star Wars 501st Legion on "How StarWars Sayes the World" started on a personal note: "I'll never forget being in the drive-in with my parents...Star Wars was a mind-blowing experience and I've been a fan all my life.'

Noted Ridley, "Some fans are content to collect action figures... other fans want to be action figures!" And, as an adult, "I found a support group of like-minded people

who do great things."

Alvin Johnson founded the 501st Legion in 1996 when he put together a detailed costume for the much-heralded rerelease of Star Wars. Thereafter the Legion became known as "The World's Definitive Imperial Star Wars Costuming Organization."

"One Storm Trooper is creepy but more are a legion," and, said Ridley, a "Force" to be reckoned

The organization is now international and Ridley belongs to the Channel Islands Squad. Star Wars creator George Lucas often calls upon members to make

she could hug me..."

McLean thanked former Police Chief MacKinnon for his work in helping to establish the monument noting "Thank you sir, and thank you Brad and Carlos,' for their continued efforts to keep the memorial updated.

"This obviously has become a passion," for Tallent and Juarez, and McLean also noted Hemminger and her sacrifice.

McLean also recognized longtime Citizens Patrol volunteer and veteran Kenny Zimmet for his service to country.

Juarez, who served on the original SPPD Memorial committee along with Commander Ish Cordero, told how the monument came to be after a "Ghost Walk" story called "Weird Coincidences" addressed the death of Officer Barmore.

His widow Betty Barmore contacted Mary Alice Orcutt Henderson, who oversaw the Santa Paula Theater Center fundraiser, asking why she had not been consulted.

"Mary Alice called Nils Rueckert" and the committee was formed to create the memorial, dedicated May 21, 2011 after a vear of fundraising including the sale of bricks for SPPD personnel that helped fund the obelisk.

"Today we celebrate the third threshold" on the west side of monument park.

"Sincetheparkwascompleted we lost two officers," Bartlett and Hemminger who are the focus of memorial benches and plaques facing the monument.

Juarez noted that brick orders kept coming in up until last week and no doubt more bricks will be installed in the future especially as bricks are now available to Explorers, Citizens Patrol and volunteers.

"Citizens Patrol was founded in 1994 by Debbie and Don Johnson," and Huguette and David Johnson and Juarez noted Debbie and Don have their bricks "sideby-side forever..."

Zimmet, he added, also has a Citizens Patrol brick.

The memorial, said Juarez, "Would not have happened if not for Nils...when I began as President of Rotary he embarrassed me and said I had raised the money, but after he went to Chief MacKinnon," about creating the monument they worked closely together.

"For 14 months Nils and I talked all the time...so much that he said he talked to me more during that time than he did to his wife Beverly!"

After discussions with MacKinnon and Cordero, "We all agreed that Nils," chairman of the monument effort should have a brick noting his contribution and time spent.

The brick said Juarez, "Is a surprise...I hope and pray we never add more names on plaques to the memorial," of officers killed in the line of duty, "but that we continue to add bricks to the threshold," of past and present SPPD personnel, office staff and

volunteers. Cordero thanked Juarez and others for their efforts on behalf of the memorial and noted, "I am honored and proud to have my brick next to my father, he was my hero."

it was only one Storm Trooper," and the boy soon enjoyed the encounter. The 501st Legion Southern California Garrison covers Los Angeles, Orange, Ventura, Riverside, San Bernardino, Kern, Santa Barbara, and San Luis Obispo counties. Members include teachers, business professionals, police officers, and more.

The 501st as well as the Channel



into Crime Scene Investigation.

While with the Ventura Police Department, Raad met SPPD Senior Officer Canine Handler Allen Macias who urged him to consider joining the Santa Paula Police Department.

Raad joined the SPPD force a year ago: "It's been a great experience, Santa Paula is a great city," said Raad.

In response to questions from Rotarians, Raad noted he has a body camera — "A great thing!" — worn while on duty other than gatherings such as the Rotary

Vote for Smart Investment Moves

The presidential election is little more than a month away. Like all elections, this one has generated considerable interest, and, as a citizen, you may well be following it closely. But as an investor, how much should you be concerned about the outcome?

Probably not as much as you might think. Historically, the financial markets have done well - and done poorly - under both Democratic and Republican administrations. Also, many factors affecting investment performance have little or nothing to do with the occupant of the White House. Consequently, no one can claim, with any certainty, that one candidate is going to be "better for the markets" than another one.

Still, this isn't to say that any given presidential administration will have no effect at all on investors. For example, a president could propose changes to the laws governing investments, and if Congress passes those laws, investors could be affected.

But in looking at the broader picture, there's not much evidence that a particular president is going to affect the overall return of your investment portfolio. As mentioned above, many factors - corporate earnings, interest rates, foreign affairs, even natural disasters - can and will influence the financial markets. But in evaluating a president's potential effect on your investments, you also need to consider something else: Our political system does not readily accommodate radical restructuring of any kind. So it's difficult for any president to implement huge policy shifts and that's actually good for the

financial markets, which, by their nature, dislike uncertainty, chaos and big changes.

The bottom line? From your viewpoint as an investor, don't worry too much about what happens in November. Instead, follow these investment strategies:

• Stay invested. If you stop investing when the market is down in an effort to cut your losses, you may miss the opportunity to participate in the next rally and the early stages of a rally are typically when the biggest gains

• Diversify. By spreading your dollars among an array of investments, such as stocks, bonds and other investments, you can help reduce the possibility of your portfolio taking a big hit if a market downturn primarily affected just one type of financial asset. Keep in mind though, that diversification can't guarantee profits or protect against all losses.

 Stay within your risk tolerance. Investing always involves risk, but you'll probably be more successful (and less stressed out) if you don't stray beyond your individual risk tolerance. At the same time, if you invest too conservatively, you might not achieve the growth potential you need to reach your goals. So you will need to strike an appropriate balance.

 Forget about chasing "hot" stocks. Many so-called "experts" encourage people to invest in today's "hot" stocks. But by the time you hear about them, these stocks - if they were ever "hot" to begin with-have probably already $cooled\,off. More importantly, they$ might not have been suitable for your needs, anyway. In any case, there's really no "short cut" to investment success.
